3. To allow children to experience different learning programmes and technology available in school.
4. To teach high quality creative ICT lessons.
5. To continue to develop and intergrade ICT across the school in all lessons.
6. To continue to develop new skills and knowledge of current ICT.
7. To extend and further develop children's confidence in becoming ICT literate.
8. To develop and maintain children's awareness of staying safe online.
9. To develop children's awareness of the uses of ICT in the world around us.
10. To participate in the annually 'safer inter day' and 'Anti-bullying week'.
