Class News

Tyne Class

In Tyne Class the children have enjoyed learning about Chinese New Year. We listened to the story 'The Great Race' and learnt how the Emperor named each year after an animal. The children used their phonic knowledge to write a label for each animal on their Chinese zodiac calendar. The children had lots of fun exploring the animals in the small world area and recreating the great race! In maths we have been combining groups to find the total, the children have been great at representing this using a part whole model, ten frames and numicon. Thames Class

What a busy half term Thames class have had! In English we have used our knowledge of different types of punctuation to write letters and instructions on how to save a whale. We used the Julia Donaldson book 'The Snail and the Whale' as a discussion point and discussed various strategies to help the whale, including calling the RNLI. In Maths we have been making equal groups to develop our understanding of multiplication and division. In Science we have explored our senses and looked at animals and their offspring, We had great fun during Dot day, using different techniques to create artwork. In Geography we have looked at aerial photographs and identified features in our local area and in London. Perhaps the children could use Google images at home to identify significant landmarks or features. Thank you for your support with the Science project, we all learnt some amazing facts and the children were excellent presenters.

Rhine Class

In Rhine Class, we have been writing our own cinquain poems about volcanoes. At home, perhaps the children could have a go at creating a cinquain poem about something they enjoy? In maths, year 3 have completed their work on measures and year 4, have completed their work on perimeters. In Commando Joe, the children have carried out the last of the teamwork tasks related to Nelly Bly and made a steamboat for the last part of her journey. We learnt how to play 'Portsmouth' on the glockenspiel in music and showcased our gymnastics routine to our class in P.E. In R.E. we have thought about the world that Jesus wanted and produced artwork to reflect this and in Geography, we have found out about the volcanologist Stephanie Grocke.

Nile Class

The children in Nile class have had a fabulous visit to the Laing Art Gallery. During their visit, they have had the opportunity to study a local photographer (Chris Killip) and review water colour paintings of the River Tyne, exploring the various uses of the river. The children also created their very own dazzle boats, which were used to confuse the enemy. What can your child tell you about a dazzle boat and what other interesting facts can the discover about dazzle boats or Chris Killip?


