#### **Learning Achievements**

- Class 1 In Maths this week, we have continued to explore the teen numbers and how to represent them. In Literacy, we created 'Wanted' posters for Len and Hugh the naughty robbers from our story 'What the Ladybird Heard'. We put our posters up around the school so that everyone knows to look out for them. We have also been exploring non-fiction books about minibeasts to write facts about them and we played 'Guess the minibeast'. In Forest school, the children gave the bug hotel a refurbishment and it's now looking very inviting! We learnt how to programme the Beebots and have used them to move around our map of the farm from our story that we created last week. In RE, we talked about our favourite Bible stories and we read a new story 'The Good Samaritan'. This lead to a discussion about how to call for help if needed and how to dial 999. Mrs Storrow brought in some frogspawn so we have been watching the changes carefully.
- Class 2 We enjoyed practising our ball skills in PE with NUFC. In English, we have listened to 'Superworm' and designed a missing poster. In Maths, we have worked on finding halves and quarters. We have continued to find out about different minibeasts. In RE, we have been looking at Muhammad (PBUH) and why he is important to Islam.
- Class 3 This week, we have been revisiting multiplication and division, whilst still drip feeding addition and subtraction using the column method. We have also practised our fraction work using apples and chocolate to help us. In English, we have been finding out about rhyming couplets and have written our own volcano poem. In Geography, we have been researching volcanoes and finding out where they are around the World, when they last erupted and how long they have been there, as well as some other interesting facts. In Music, we have created a soundscape, which linked to our wordscape in English. In Science, we have been investigating which rocks are the hardest and/or most porous by setting up our own scientific investigations. Our guided reading text this week has been 'The Firework Maker's Daughter' by Philip Pullman. Our 'fixed feasts' of handwriting, spelling and grammar have continued.
- **Class 4** This week in Class 4, we have been developing our knowledge of poetry and riddles. We have been examining different riddles and a poem, discussing the key features. As a Class we prepared a riddle for the King and his dinner guests, as riddles were popular during Tudor times for entertainment and courting purposes. The children have also worked together in pairs to create their own riddle for the class. In Maths, Year 5 have continued their work on adding and subtracting decimals. Year 6 have been working on ratio word problems, finished this topic and are now starting their work on decimals. We have enjoyed both of our PE sessions this week. Class 4 is glad to be doing young leaders again.
