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A Message from the Head Teacher

I would like to start my Head Teacher's message with a heart-felt thank you to our children, staff, governors, parents and wider community for their support, understanding, flexibility and kindness over the past week. As well as delivering the Year 6 SATs, we had a full inspection of our school on the Wednesday and Thursday. Children were absolutely amazing and shone like the stars we know they are, even through some disruption to normal routine which the inspection caused. Staff spoke eloquently to inspectors about teaching and learning within the school and our parent community were incredibly supportive in their views and opinions of Henshaw Primary.

In my 18 years of teaching, I have never seen such a positive outcome to the Ofsted Parent view; 97% (33 out of 34 responses) would recommend the school, feel their children are safe in school and are happy at school (with lots of overwhelmingly positive free-text responses). Myself and the staff at Henshaw are incredibly grateful for the communication and positivity you all bring to our school. Workshop Wednesday took on a twist this week with children given the opportunity to be taught by another teacher; Year 5 and 6 went down to Tyne Class for STEM challenges, Reception went to Thames Class to learn about the Great Fire of London and bake bread, Year 1.2 went to Rhine Class to write poetry and Year 3.4 went to Nile Class to use computers to design Kandinsky-style art. Thank you to Mrs Hancock for arranging teas, coffees and tasty treats for the parents.

Class News

Tyne Class

Tyne class are learning all about minibeasts. We made a wormery and found lots of juicy worms to live in it. We have been spotting lots of minibeasts whilst playing outside. We also made wildflower seed bombs to help encourage bees to our playground. We have been practising our writing and created some fantastic Wanted posters for the naughty characters in our story 'What the Ladybird Heard'. Maybe you could make your own seed bombs at home to encourage bees and butterflies into your garden.

Thames Class

Thames Class have been very busy writing letters to Prince Albert from Queen Victoria to say thank you for the Bathing Machine, which he built. They remembered to use some fantastic descriptive sentences and used a range of punctuation, including apostrophes, exclamation marks and question marks. In Maths we have been working on fractions and enjoyed making a sandwich to help our understanding of finding quarters and halves. In Science we have started to look at habitats and find out why some living things are suited to a certain environment. Perhaps you could have a look in your local area and see which living things you can find (plants or animals). We thoroughly enjoyed finding out about farm animals and had a lovely walk in the forest on our visit to Rushey Hall Farm followed by games in the barn.

Rhine Class

In Rhine Class, it has been a very practical week. We have worked on developing a machine to move heavy objects in our outdoor learning environment using wheels, incline, pulleys and levers or a combination. In singing, we have started to learn a new song. In Workshop Wednesday, we made Kandinsky images using technology. In English, we learnt to write sentences using 'ispace'. In maths, Year 3 have been working on their multiplication tables and fractions of objects. Year 4 have really been trying to crack the code for multiplication in readiness for their multiplication tables. We have looked at the work of Jim Kwik in PSHE and strategies he uses to develop memory. It would help if children could practise using ispace at home to develop their sentence structure.

Nile Class

During design and technology, the children have been looking at processed food with Mrs Hosking. First of all, the children compared processed food to whole foods. After that, the children had the opportunity to make and taste bread baked in class, which they said tasted delicious. Please work with your child this week and investigate how many different kinds of bread are available to make or buy today.
