Class News

Tyne Class

In Tyne class we have explored friendship qualities alongside the book The Little Red Hen. We all worked together as a team to make the delicious bread and got to share it with our friends in nursery too. The children used their phonics skills to recognise the initial sounds of all the ingredients we used and created a shopping list for our home corner. We really enjoyed watching the materials change during each process, especially when we added the yeast into our mixture and it bubbled! It would be great if you could involve the children at home when writing a shopping list or helping you prepare a meal by measuring out the ingredients.

Thames Class

Thames class have had a fantastic week sharing their science experiments. They were all fantastic. Thank you for your support with these. We have also been busy looking at information posters and their features to help us make our own about the Queen. In History we have looked at significant people and sorted them into categories, for example artist, monarch or activist. In English we have practised nouns, verbs, capital letters and full stops. In Science we have looked at how plants grow and change over time. Perhaps the children could observe the changing seasons on an Autumn walk. In Maths year 1 have been practising counting backwards and finding 1 more or 1 less. Year 2 have worked hard partitioning numbers and looking at how many tens and ones are in a 2 digit number.

Rhine Class

This week in Rhine class, we have been sharing our scientific experiments and information. We have had some stunning examples including: a tray lift; coke and mentos; brillo pads and fire; wind generated electricity; Powerpoints about bird song; life cycles; cornflour and an exploding bag - to name but a few. The scientific vocabulary that the children have been using and learning through this experience has been fantastic. Along with this, we have begun to write a historical narrative about Odin the Viking god. In maths, we have been learning about flexible partitioning and we thoroughly enjoyed our first music experience - not least because we started with a song that we had been learning with our music theme Charanga. Next week, we are going to continue our historical narrative about Odin, so any help with research about Odin at home would give the children a head start.

Nile Class

Science week has been amazing! Not only have the children made me proud with their science presentations, but they have also inspired each other with all the facts, experiments, and information shared in class. Well Done Nile class! This enthusiasm then continued into this week's science lesson – making parachutes to test air resistance. What can the children discover regarding upthrust and water resistance ready for next week?
