# Tyne Class

This week in Tyne class, we have been doing some more learning about the first Christmas. We learnt all about the Nativity story and created a wonderful picture with all the characters on it. Maybe you can retell the story to someone in your family? We started to create pictures for our time capsule. We are very excited about burying it and digging it up in Year 6. We have been busy practising our Christmas show and have been doing a great job at remembering the words too.

#### Thames Class

Thames class have been busy in Maths looking at addition. Year 1 have been looking at addition problems and Year 2 have been adding a 2 digit number and a 1 digit number by crossing 10. In English, we have looked at the features of letters and discussed Environmental issues. We have also written our own letter to Sir David Attenborough using conjunctions and different sentence types. In Science, we enjoyed investigating which surface ice melts more quickly on. I am sure the children would enjoy sharing this investigation at home. In Computers, we have produced some super images based on the work of the artist Piet Mondrian. We are also busy with the preparations for our Christmas performance. The children have been singing beautifully.

#### Rhine Class

In Rhine Class we have been writing our own poems - first, it was Haiku poems and then it was limericks. The children are becoming familiar with the different features of each style and we have had some excellent examples. In maths, we are focusing on multiplication tables regularly to try and develop quick recall of facts in random order. Any additional practise at home will really help. I have put the tables onto TT Rockstars that they are practising. In science, we have been working on collecting and presenting data. The children went around the school building finding light sources, tallying and presenting on a bar graph. In music, we have been singing through our Christmas play songs in readiness for our performance. In PSHCE, we have been thinking about all the places that we visit in our local community and how we use them.

#### Nile Class

The children are all starting to sound amazing as they play their ukuleles, supported by Mr Reed. They are following the music notations written on the board and singing along as they play. Their strumming technique is improving as they support each other in remembering to play chords C and F at the correct time. This week, the children started to play and sing the song, 'Santa Claus is Coming to Town!' Please encourage your child at home to explain to you how to hold their ukulele and show you how to strum each chord.
