Learning Achievements

Class 1 - This week we have started to write Seaside poems using our senses. We are including lots of lovely adjectives. In Maths we have been doing problem solving based around the story 'Mr Gumpy's Outing'. In Forest School we made gorgeous masks and crowns covered in all the lovely flowers, leaves and grasses we have in our forest area. In RE we wrote a list of all the things we do in church and then we started to make stained glass windows. We have been talking about how to be healthy and have been sorting healthy and unhealthy foods.

Class 2 – In English, we have been finding out about Grace Darling and acting out her rescue. In Maths, Year 1 have been sequencing events, days of the week and months of the year. Year 2 have been reading the time to 5 minutes and comparing intervals of time. In Science, we have investigated which materials float or sink and explaining why. We have also enjoyed a visit to the church to talk about religious ceremonies.

Class 3 - This week, we have been creating slogans for a healthy bowel in English. We watched advertisements, accompanied them musically and then created our own musical jingles to go with our slogans. We have also learnt how to edit our work in more detail ready for publishing. For spelling and grammar, we have been looking at summarising work, improving sentences with fronted adverbials, speech marks and have completed SPAG.com, to find out how their grammatical skills are progressing - we have been pleased with the results. In guided reading, we have been looking at our class text 'The Demon Dentist' by David Walliams and completing work related to this. In science, we have been looking at the different kinds of faeces - starting with the story 'The Mole who knew it was none of his business' and we told 'Poo jokes'. We have looked at how diet can affect faeces. In maths, we have continued our work on shapes - naming 2D and 3D, looking at the properties of each, including edges, vertices, faces, parallel and perpendicular lines and lines of symmetry. The Year 4 children have also been looking at the different types of triangles. In PSHE, we have continued our work on how we change as we grow - thinking about how what we look like is influenced by our DNA. We have also started our end of term/year quizzes.

Class 4 – This week in English the children have been researching significant historical figures. They used this information to create a biography about their chosen significant figure, making sure that they included all the important features that should be included in a biography. In Maths, Year 5 has been learning about imperial units and how to solve different conversions. Year 6, have been learning about the mean and how to work out the mean. Another busy week!
