Learning Achievements

Class 1 - We've had a fantastic week jam packed full of learning and fun. We really enjoyed the Kielder Observatory workshop that taught us all about the different lights that we can't see. We had to use our scientific thinking to understand the information that Naz told us. We had a lovely trip to the Great North Museum and I'd like to say how proud we are of all the children. They were fantastic! We had a great day learning about dinosaurs, finding out about ammonites, deciphering fossils and being palaeontologists. We also explored the museum from top to bottom! We have started to write postcards all about our trip.

Class 2 – This week we have started to look at the Great Fire of London and discuss the sequence of events. In Maths Year 1 and been comparing numbers and beginning to count in steps of 2. Year 2 have been dividing by 10 and started to look at fractions. We enjoyed our visit from Kielder observatory and learned some interesting facts about light.

Class 3 – This week in Class 3, we have been continuing our work on storytelling. The stories are coming along so well and some of the vocabulary that the children are using is impressive. In Maths, we have been working on fractions of amounts - using chocolate bars and smarties! In R.E., we have been thinking about forgiveness. In PSHE, we looked at good sleeping habits and the importance of sleep on our body's health. We also practised some relaxation techniques. In science, we enjoyed the visit from Kielder Observatory where we found out about a hold 'space rocks'. Bikeability ended our busy but exciting week extremely well.

Class 4 – This week in English the children have been using the different persuasive features that they learnt last week to create rhetorical questions that they can include in their Fair Trade leaflet. In maths, Year 5 children have been multiplying and dividing fractions. Year 6 children have been working on two-step equations in algebra. In science, the children have been looking at line graphs showing the typical range of heights and growth patterns of males and females. The children were able to answer different predictions based on the two graphs. On Wednesday, we loved our lesson with Naz; learning about the different types of light and testing certain theories. In RE, the children made a responsibility pie for who was to blame for the death of Jesus.

They all passed their Level 1 and we were very proud of them all!


