Learning Achievements

Class 1 – In Reception class we started the week by exploring our Forest area. The children enjoyed playing in the mud kitchen, exploring the tree area, taking turns on the swing and finding blackberries. In literacy we started by talking about goodies and baddies. We then read the story of 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears'. We discussed whether Goldilocks is a goodie or a baddie. There was mixed opinion! We have changed our home corner into the three bears cottage and have made masks so we can act out the story. We used pictures to sequence the story and retell it. In Maths we have been using our fingers to count on and have been singing number rhymes. We have been chatting about ourselves during circle time and have been discussing our favourite toys, what makes us Unique - like Elmer the elephant and how to be a good friend. We have enjoyed the outside area where lots of role play has taken place from camping trips to goodies and baddies in the castle.

Class 2 – This week, we have enjoyed our first PE session with NUFC. We have practised place value in Maths and enjoyed planting trees in Forest Schools.

Class 3 – This week, we have experienced being hunter-gatherers. We made a basket out of willow and then searched around our school grounds for possible food from nature - we found: mint, elderberries, raspberries, blackberries, dandelions, nettles and apples. We also found out how to make string from nettles. In Maths, we have been working on place value and have been reading and creating numbers using practical apparatus. We have been counting in steps of 25, 50, 100 and 1000. In English, we have continued our work on Stig of the Dump. We learnt about Edward Ardizzone who illustrated the book and copied some of his artwork. We have continued our research on the stone age and have made our own fact lapbook. In Science, we have looked at

how to set up a scientific investigation. We have studied rocks and found out what a geologist does. In PSHE, we have been thinking about our own and each other's strengths, likes and dislikes.

Class 4 – This week, we have been researching further into our topic. In English we have been looking at different facts about Ancient Egypt. In Maths we have begun work rounding and continued looking at place value. We have looked at aerial maps and some historical sites in Egypt. For forest school, we created an Ancient Egypt death mask using only natural materials.

The NHS Immunisation conducted a postal 'consent campaign' earlier this year but unfortunately haven't had many consent forms returned, so they have asked schools to remind parents on their behalf.

COVID-19- Guidance published on 8.9.2020

What to do if a pupil is displaying symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19)

If anyone in school becomes unwell with a new, continuous cough **or** a high temperature, **or** has a loss of, **or** change in, their normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia), they must be sent home and be advised to follow the guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection.

This sets out that they must:

- self-isolate for at least 10 days
- arrange to have a test to see if they have coronavirus (COVID-19)

We appreciate that children can catch a cold and can be unwell at this time of the year but if you think your child has any of the symptoms then please follow the NHS guidance and arrange for them to have a test and inform the school office immediately.

To comply with our risk assessment and for the safety of everyone in the building we will encourage children to wash their hands regularly and practice social distancing where possible. Cleaning hours have been extended and staff are diligent in using limited resources and are cleaning items regularly throughout the day.

Negative test result

A negative result means the test did not find coronavirus.

You do not need to self-isolate if your test is negative, as long as:

- everyone you live with who has symptoms tests negative
- everyone in your support bubble who has symptoms tests negative
- you were not told to self-isolate for 14 days by NHS Test and Trace
- you feel well if you feel unwell, stay at home until you're feeling better

If you have diarrhoea or you're being sick, stay at home until 48 hours after they've stopped.
