Open Afternoon- 21.6.18

We will be holding an Open Afternoon, in conjunction with Henshaw Nursery, on Thursday 21st June from 12.30pm. This will be an opportunity for new families to come into school to see how well our children work and meet our super staff team.

Refreshments will be available in the school hall throughout the afternoon. The Friends of Henshaw will also be attending, highlighting the fantastic work they do to support our school...new members always welcome!



The children and staff will be participating in 15 minutes of walking/jogging/running every day for the rest of the Summer Term. Staff will timetable this event into the school day. It will happen Monday- Friday so the children need to have a pair of trainers in school daily to participate.

The aim of The Daily Mile is to improve the physical, social, emotional and mental health and wellbeing of our children – regardless of age, ability or personal circumstances.

It is a profoundly simple but effective concept and its impact can be transformational – improving not only the children's fitness, but also their concentration levels, mood, behaviour and general wellbeing. The Daily Mile is a social activity, wherein the children run, jog or walk – at their own pace – in the fresh air with friends. Children can occasionally pause to catch their breath, if necessary, but should aim to keep moving for the full 15 minutes.

Research has shown that The Daily Mile can even increase attainment in primary school, and parents have reported an increased interest in health and wellbeing from their children after they have started The Daily Mile.
