Learning Achievements

Class 1 - This week in Reception we have been learning the story script of The Gingerbread Man. We are getting really good at retelling the story using lots of story language and time words. We have decorated our own gingerbread men biscuits and ate them as part of our snack. We also created gingerbread men from our own pots of playdough. We became scientists on Tuesday and predicted which liquid would dissolve a gingerbread man biscuit the quickest. We were all proved wrong including Mrs Hulbert! We have been practising repeating patterns in maths and we made some repeating pattern snakes for our maths display.

Class 2 – Class 2 have had a very busy week. We have been writing our own Mnemonics. We have been exploring our 5 senses so went for an Autumnal walk. We also enjoyed marshmallows and hot chocolate around the campfire. In Maths, Year 1 have been looking at number bonds within 10 and Year 2 have been finding 10 more and 10 less.

Class 3 – This week has been our innovation week and the main focus of this has been to learn about monuments and to design and create a piece of 'groundwork' at the front of the school in the shape of Hallie's head (our school reading dog). The children have named the area 'Hallie's Hill' and when completed it should be visible from the air, like the Uffington White Horse. We also learnt about the Lindow Man – hope they don't have nightmares! In PHSE, we have been deciding upon our class rules, rewards and consequences. As part of this, we have also looked at some of our rules in society – road safety, stranger danger etc. We also did a quiz about rules and some children thought that the Prime Minister makes the rules and that this was Donald Trump! So some learning needed here!

Class 4 - We have had an exciting week with our topic project. We have made a sarcophagus, enjoyed acting, practiced our embalming skills and our 'Walk like an Egyptian' dance. In Maths, Year 6 have been working with division using practical, short and long methods. Year 5 have been completed their work looking at different types of charts. We also completed our science experiment of turning milk into plastic (casein). In forest school we made leaf chains for our autumn window and sang our songs!

Schoolcomms

Our new cashless system is now up and running. Paying money to the school online is simple and easy!

You can now make payments online to the school for things like dinner money and school trips. Paying for school items online is quicker and easier for you, safer for children and more efficient for the school.

The system is called School Gateway – and it's available for you to use now.

1. Go to www.schoolgateway.com

2. When you visit the School Gateway website for the first time, please select 'New User' and enter your email address and mobile telephone number you have registered with the school

3. The system will send a PIN code to your phone; please enter this PIN code and your account will be activated for you.

As soon as you've got the system set-up, you'll be able to pay money to the school online rather than send cash or cheques. The school will inform you of payments that are due.

If you've recently changed your email address or mobile telephone number, please let us know so we can update our records.
