# **Learning Achievements**

- Class 1 This week we have introduced our new topic Starry Night. We have been reading the story 'Whatever Next!' and have created props from the story to play with. We've also been talking about what we'd take to space with us. We've 'hot seated' being the bear from the story and have been answering questions about what his trip to space was like. In Maths we have further explored 5 and how it is made. We have been comparing groups and using 'more than' and 'fewer than'. We have all made a new year's resolution and have drawn and written about it. We realised that a year is a long time to keep a resolution but we are going to do our best! In Forest school we made fat balls for the birds. We hung them on the trees and on our new bird table and we are hoping to spot some different birds.
- **Class 2** This week, in English, we have found out facts and information about the Queen, in readiness for her Platinum Jubilee. In Maths, we have continued our work on addition. We all enjoyed our first week of swimming lessons too!
- Class 3 This week, we have been learning about the features of non-chronological reports and have watched some footage of a sport's writer Sonali Shah explaining how she writes a report. We have then carried out our own research about people who have challenges, but have overcome these to achieve their goals. This has linked with our PSHE and has included famous people like: Ade Adepitan, Helen Keller, Lionel Messi, Stevie Wonder, Everlynne Glennie, Stephen Hawking and Marlee Matlin. We have completed our 'layers of the Earth' natural sculpture outside and labelled it. In Maths, we have continued our work on multiplication and in R.E., we have considered what being 'fishers of people' means. The children were 'disgusted' when they thought that I was eating dog food to demonstrate that you should never judge a book by it's cover some children saw through it and knew that I wouldn't really do that! The children also enjoyed their gymnastics session where we got to use the large apparatus. So a great week all round.
- **Class 4** This week in English we are focussing on Non-chronological reports and have been looking at different features and structures we could use. In Science we have been learning about food chains in allotments and different animal life cycles In Maths, the Year 5 children have been working on estimating and calculating area of shapes and irregular shapes. The Year 6 children have finished working on fractions and have been looking at coordinates and quadrants. The children have done really well in their Maths end of topic assessments....Well done everyone!
