## Letter from the Vicar

Within days of receiving this magazine we will all be asked to cast a vote in the general election. Given that this election falls only two years after the last general election, and a year after the European referendum, and not least a month after our local elections, no one could blame us for arguing that we might be experiencing a little election fatigue. But as Christians our engagement with political life in all its forms is, I think, one of our most important obligations.

At university I studied Politics and Theology. As a result I would joke that I would never be invited to dinner parties as I would only ever want to talk about politics or religion. There is a strange belief that somehow these two do now and should not mix. Interventions by Bishops in political debates are met with mutterings from politicians of various colours about turbulent and meddling priests.

But the heart of our faith is based on a deeply political imperative. In the Gospels, when Jesus summarises God's law, he tells us that we should: 'love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your mind, and with strength, and love your neighbour as yourself. In worship, Sunday by Sunday, we find ourselves meeting the first part of this imperative, but we should never miss the importance of the second part. To love your neighbour as yourself is a political command. It means engaging with the needs of others, it means acknowledging our reliance on each other in all things, and it means seeking justice through love for all, as God loves us.

We can do this in a multitude of ways. We can support local organisations and projects such as contributing to the West Northumberland Food Bank through the new collection point at the Village Store. It means, particularly after the atrocities in Manchester, engaging with all our neighbours of different faiths and races and beliefs. It means engaging with our political process in whatever way we can, not least by voting. And it means praying for all those standing for election, and those who will be elected, that we would be part of a country and political society that truly loves its neighbours as itself. **Benjamin**
