Class News

Tyne Class

This week in Tyne class we have been helping Pete, our counting puppet, to count carefully. Maybe you can practise your counting, with 1:1 correspondence, at home? You can count objects but also sounds. We have started to learn about Hinduism and the festival of Diwali and we made our own rangoli patterns outside. We have explored the story of 'The Lion and the Mouse' and have discussed equality. We learnt that everyone should be treated the same, whether they are old or young, big or small. We also got creative and made some lovely lion faces and some mice. We practised our cutting, painting & fixing skills.

Thames Class

Thames class have been busy writing their own poems. They made lists of nouns, verbs and adjectives to help with their writing. In Maths, we have been looking at related facts and number bonds to 10 and 100. In Design Technology, we worked as a team to build our own dens. We have talked about the significance of Remembrance Day and enjoyed a walk to the local memorial, followed by a visit to the park.

Rhine Class

In Rhine Class, we have been planning our Newspaper article about the Viking attack on Lindisfarne, which should be completed next week. We have been playing some 'new' spelling games, which the children are really enjoying. Some of the games we have played so far have been: word searches; boxed spellings (how many times can you fit your spelling words in a box and spelling tic-tac-toe. Why not play these games at home too along with Spelling Shed to help reinforce these... they make learning spellings much more fun! In Maths, we have been learning how to add and subtract using different methods including the build it, draw it, write it, explain it approach. In P.E., we have started our module on gymnastics. In PSHCE, we have completed work around 'protected characteristics' with a focus on disability. All this and rehearsals for our Remembrance Service in music - what a busy week!

Nile Class

In Nile Class, the children are enjoying reading the story of 'The River King' and the legend of Encante written by Saviour Pirotta. The children can't wait to finish reading the story and discover if Mr Domingo is actually Bufeo Colorado. This week the children have had the opportunity to act out their predictions of what could happen next in the story.
