#### **Learning Achievements**

**Class 1** - This week we have been continuing our work all about Africa. We have been reading the story 'Fatou Fetch the Water'. We wrote questions for one of the characters and then 'hot seated' being that character. The children did a fantastic job. In Maths we have been learning about grouping, sharing and halving. We really enjoyed our Commando Joes session where we used our problem solving skills. We have listened to an African folk tale about the first music and identified which instruments sound like the characters in the story. We then created our own rhythms and enjoyed playing the African instruments.

Class 2 – We have enjoyed the introduction to our new topic 'Land Ahoy!' We looked at some paintings and wrote our own descriptive story. We also used charcoal to draw our own boats. In Maths, Year 1 have been counting forwards and backwards within 100 and partitioning numbers; Year 2 have been looking at odd and even numbers. We saved crocodile eggs in Commando Joe's!

**Class 3** - This week, Class 3 have begun working on their new theme 'Bile, Bottoms and Burps'. We have carried out some research into the digestive system and teeth and their functions. We are creating a fact file about these subjects. In Maths, we have been learning about statistics and carrying out tallies to create charts, tables and pictograms. We also had our first session with Commando Joe's, which was fantastic! The children showed excellent team working skills and resilience.

Class 4 — This week we have been learning about our new topic 'Revolution'. The children have learnt about the development of education during the Victorian era and the different types of schools that children could attend. We are using this information to write non-chronological reports. In Maths, Year 5 have started a new topic 'position and direction'; Year 6 have just finished their 'properties of shape' topic. Class 4 loved Commando Joe's this week building obstacle courses for each other and using different codes to go through it. In PSHE, we have been discussing Self and Body Image. In Science, we have completed our POP task for our new topic 'Can fruit light a bulb?'
