## Learning Achievements

**Class 1** - We've been busy this week filling in our patchwork Elmer with all the wonderful things we are good at. We've been learning the Elmer song. We have also continued to talk about how we are all unique. We've also been practising our cutting skills and pencil control skills. We've enjoyed a Forest School session and have been exploring our outdoor area. We enjoyed our NUFC PE session. We've been singing number rhymes and sorting objects in different ways. We have also started to explore the Busy Things programme on School 360.

**Class 2** – We have had another busy week. We have enjoyed PE with NUFC again. We have talked about ourselves and our families and written our own autobiography. We have also been talking about life in the 1950s. In Science, we have started to explore the properties of materials. We have continued the Creation story in RE and drew our own Creation pictures.

**Class 3** - This week in Class 3, we have been looking at character and setting descriptions in English. Mathematically, we have continued our work on Roman Numerals - year 4 and place value in year 3. We had an interesting first swimming session where we took the scenic route. In Art, we have looked at primary and secondary colours and had a go at mixing these. We looked at how watercolour is translucent and how we can make it opaque through layering. We used this technique to create cave setting - linked to our literacy. In Science, we have been learning more about food groups and how our digestive system works.

**Class 4** – This week, we have read Chinese folktales and have started planning our own narrative poem using similes, personification, alliteration and expanded noun phrases. In Maths, we have continued our work on place value.
