Learning Achievements

- **Class 1** This week we have been learning all about the Easter story and why Christians celebrate Easter. The children worked in groups to write and draw the story and did a fantastic job. We have continued our work on patterns and have been creating more complex patterns and solving problems involving patterns. We have been doing some circle time work about Kind Hands and how to be kind to our friends. In PE, we have been developing our throwing and catching skills.
- Class 2 We have had another busy week. In Maths, Year 1 have been working out Maths length problems and Year 2 have been counting faces and vertices on shapes. We have also been working hard writing sentences using adjectives and expanded noun phrases. In PE, we had fun finding our way around an obstacle course. We have all enjoyed playing with our friends again this week.
- **Class 3** This week, we have been learning about the work of Charles Darwin and collecting facts from nonfiction texts in readiness to write a biography. In P.E., we have learnt how to defend and invade in a game of 'protect the pin'. We have also set our own exercise routine and practised some of the different exercises that we can use. In R.E., we have continued our work on the Easter story. In Maths, we have completed our end of term quizzes and been practising our + x and division in Year 4. In Year 3, we have continued our work on fractions. In Art, we have painted sea creatures and in Science, we have learnt about how animals have adapted to life in the deep sea and sea conservation.
- **Class 4** We have had a busy week in Class 4! In English, we have been working on speech writing for our conversations between Sherlock Holmes and Dr Watson. We have been editors and have suggested changes for our work. In Maths, Year 6 have been learning about areas of different shapes. Year 5 have completed their fraction unit and have started learning about decimal places. We have had lots of fun with all the other busy jobs we have been doing this week too.

Sickness bug and general colds

As you may know, we have a few children off with a sickness bug and colds at the moment.

To try and prevent further cases, and to continue to comply with our Covid-19 risk assessment, we are encouraging all the children to thoroughly wash their hands as often as possible in school. We are also continuing to make sure that all areas of the school are thoroughly cleaned and disinfected once the children leave.

If your child suffers with diarrhoea and/or vomiting, please encourage them to drink plenty of fluids to stop dehydration.

We would ask you to keep your child at home for at least 48 hours after the last episode of vomiting and/or diarrhoea (this is national guidance).

We would continue encourage all families to let school know if any of you are showing any COVID symptoms.

The symptoms of Corona virus are:

- a new, continuous cough
- a high temperature
- a loss of, or change in, normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia).
