Learning Achievements

- Class 1 This week the fairies left us some magic beans. We planted them and they grew into lollipops! It was very exciting. We have also planted some real beans which we hope will grow into tall beanstalks like the one in our story 'Jack and the Beanstalk'. Emily told us all about her fairy jar at home so the children decided they wanted to make one at school. They also wrote a note for the fairies and put it inside their jar. We have done some fantastic writing practise and have been filling up our Message Centre. In Maths, we have been exploring 2D shapes and we went on a walk to spot them in our environment. We have also been reading the story 'The Button Box' and have been matching and sorting buttons in different ways. As it's anti-bullying week we have been talking about being kind and using kind words. We have challenged ourselves to complete 40 acts of kindness throughout the week.
- Class 2 We have been writing riddles in English. In Maths Year 2 have looked at number bonds to 100 and Year 1 have been adding numbers. In Science we investigated what we could do with our hands when blindfolded. In Commando Joes we built Buckingham Palace and a new crown for the Queen!
- Class 3 This week, we have been continuing our work on Cinquain poems and have written a poem about the Amesbury Archer from the Bronze Age. In Maths, Year 4 have started to look at carrying out the inverse to check their calculations. Year 3 have been continuing their work on column addition and subtraction. In Science, Year 3 have sorted foods into the different food groups on the Eatwell plate and produced a balanced meal for their 'client' in their role as researchers and trainers. In Year 4, the children have been working on food chains and thinking about the impact that the loss of a species would have on a food chain. In R.E., we have been working on paintings of the Trinity. In History, the children have found out more about the Amesbury Archer and have started work on life in the Iron Age. We also attempted to create a roundhouse each to put onto a model hillfort we found this challenging! It has been anti-bullying week and we have been thinking about using kind words. It has been delightful to hear the children saying such kind and supportive things to each other. We have also been thinking about 'other people' and skipping/hoola hooping for Children in Need.
- **Class 4** This week we have been writing our own science fiction/culture stories based on our Class read, 'Bronze and Sunflower'. In Maths, we have continued our work on fractions and cubed/square numbers. In Art, we have enjoyed using watercolours to create different effects to use on our taoties.
