Welcome back!

A warm welcome back to all of our pupils, parents and families, particularly to those who have joined Reception this year and to those who are new to the school in other year groups. It has been wonderful to see the children back in school this week and to witness so many smiles from both pupils, staff and parents!

The children have settled well in to their new classes and are enjoying being back at school and seeing their friends.

Curriculum

As a school we aim to deliver a curriculum that builds on prior learning, deepens knowledge and enhances skills that foster lifelong learning and achievement. We provide children with an engaging, exciting and empowering curriculum that equips them for today and tomorrow.

At Henshaw Primary School the curriculum is designed to allow children to develop interpersonal skills, build resilience and become creative and critical thinkers. Our curriculum is implemented through a series of lessons which build on concepts, skills and knowledge. Each topic starts with a session to engage learners and build an interest right from the onset. The implementation is adapted to specific learning needs in order to provide support and challenge, ensuring an inclusive curriculum meets the needs of all our pupils.

Years 1 and 2: Childhood

Years 3 and 4: Through the ages Years 5 and 6: Dynamic Dynasties

Learning Achievements

Class 1 - We've had a busy week getting used to being in Reception. We have been learning about all our new routines and have enjoyed exploring all the activities in our new classroom and outdoor area. We've been singing 'Five Little Speckled Frogs' and have been using our fingers to show the numbers. We've read Elmer and have talked about how we are all unique and what makes us special. Some of us have made 3D Elmers from milk cartons and tissue paper. We've all painted a self-portrait for our display, thinking carefully about the details.

Class 2 – We have enjoyed our first week back with our friends and have started to research our new topic 'Childhood'. In RE we looked at the Creation story and were creators. In Maths we have been recapping place value.

Class 3 - This week, in Class 3, we have been introduced to our new theme: Through the Ages. It all started on Monday morning when myself and Mrs Hall were dressed as stone age women to welcome the children - although one of the children thought I was a 'woolly mammoth'! We have completed a timeline, learnt a song entitled 'We are living in the stone age', had a go at cave drawings using soot and chalk - we decided against using bat droppings due to hygiene risks! We tried to start a fire with dry leaves, grass and sticks - it didn't work and that was using matches not flint. In Art, we have explored watercolours and looked at how they can be translucent. In music, we have started to think about 'what sound is' and have watched a choreographed piece entitled 'connect it', which is using purely body sounds. In Science, we have sorted food into the food groups. We also carried out a quiz using stations to find information about the stone age. In Maths, Year 4 have been using Roman numerals and solving addition and subtraction involving these. Year 3 have been thinking about place value and counting in steps of 10, 50 and 100 and looking at the patterns within these. All in all, a very busy first week and we were impressed with how all of the children have risen to the challenge.

Class 4 – This week in Class 4 we have been getting to know each other and learning about our new topic Dymanic Dynasties. In Maths we have been working on place value.

Free School Meals/Pupil Premium

If your child is eligible for 'free school meals' and you register them for this, we'll receive extra funding called 'pupil premium'. We use this extra money to improve the educational provision and resources at the school.

What is pupil premium funding?

Pupil premium funding from the government is given to schools to help pupils reach their full potential, regardless of their background or financial situation. It's provided for pupils who:

- Are registered for free school meals
- Have been registered for free school meals at any point in the past 6 years
- Are, or have been, in care

For example, we've previously used pupil premium funding for:

- Educational provision/resources
- Financial support towards trips, clubs and music tuition
- Academic interventions
- Wellbeing and self-esteem building interventions

Is my child eligible for free school meals?

Your child might be eligible if you access:

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
- Income Support
- Income-based Job Seekers Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run on paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

Universal Infant Free School Meals

Currently, pupils in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to a free school meal thanks to a different government funding scheme known as universal infant free school meals (UIFSM). You shouldn't confuse UIFSM with free schools meals and the pupil premium.

If your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 and is eligible for free school meals according to the criteria above, you should still register because we'll receive the extra pupil premium funding to help your child in school.

Does my child have to eat the free school meals?

No. Pupils who are registered for free school meals don't have to eat them. If you're eligible but you want your child to have packed lunches you should still register because the school will receive the funding which can support your child in other ways.

How do I register?
