We have been astounded by the knowledge and enthusiasm the children have shown when they have been sharing their projects – super researching, enquiry skills and confident presentations.

Year 3 and 4 have started their 'Beneath Our Feet' project last week, where they worked with children at Greenhead Primary to explore our mining heritage and the work of local artist; Norman Cornish. Year 6 have also started their university workshops with their PhD mentor from Newcastle University and have already produced some stunning written outcomes.

This week, the children have also had a visit from the Tynedale Hospice Association, who have told us all about the wonderful, caring work they do in our community. We hope to do some fundraising activities next half term; Our School Council will take the lead on this.

#### **Class News**

#### Tyne Class

In Tyne class, we have been learning about adding two groups together. We have practised this using everyday objects, dominoes and numicon pieces. Some of us have made our own dominoes and added the spots together. We have also learnt how to say and write number sentences. Can you practise adding two groups of objects together at home? You could use cutlery or teddies. Can you say the number sentence to match your adding calculation?

#### Thames Class

Thames class have been writing letters to Katie Morag and including their grammar and punctuation, contractions, conjunctions and capital letters. In Maths, Year 2 have been looking at multiplication and division. They could consolidate this at home by practising making equal groups and sharing. Year 1 have been comparing numbers using the vocabulary greater than and less than. They could consolidate this at home by finding greatest amounts of objects or least amount of objects, or even seeing who has the greatest amount of peas on their dinner plate!! We are looking at animal groups in Science and talking about their features. We continue to work hard learning our sounds in Read, Write Inc and reading our books. In Geography, we have been finding out about the RNLI and discovered some very interesting facts.

#### Rhine Class

In Rhine Class, we have been finding out about rivers around the world. We have then been using our research to write a report about the rivers of our choice. We are presenting these in a lapbook style. In Maths, we have started work on measures and are learning how to find the perimeter of different shapes. Our science theme on light is 'heating up' now as we get closer to finding the suspect - we found out this week that some of the suspects couldn't have stolen the diamond earrings as their clothing was light coloured and would have reflected in the torch light meaning that they would have been seen. If you could look out for reflective surfaces this week and think about what makes them reflective that will really help consolidate this work. I have been really impressed with how much information the children have retained in our work on Sikhism. We have also shared our history homework with projects including: Titanic, Berners Lee, the hole in the ozone layer, hyrdothermal vents, Simon Weston, Stephen Hawking. They were amazing.

#### Nile Class

The children in Nile class have had an electric time this week! In small groups, they have created an experiment to explore what would happen if they added extra bulbs, buzzer or motors to their circuit. It didn't take the children long to realise they needed to create a simple circuit first before they could then add extra components. From this they then realised that one cell does not have enough voltage to run more than one component. In class we have worked with simple series circuits, why not explore with your child at home what the difference is between a series and a parallel circuit?
