#### **Learning Achievements**

**Class 1** - We have been reading the story 'Peace at Last' and have created a beautiful story map showing each room in Mr Bear's house. In maths we have been exploring 6, 7 and 8 and have been finding different ways of making those numbers. We have been learning all about Chinese New Year and have created dragon face masks, lanterns, dancing dragons and have practised Chinese writing to make a wonderful Chinese calendar. We enjoyed eating prawn crackers and made a vegetable teriyaki noodle stir fry which we tried to eat with chop sticks! It was quite tricky but we persevered!

**Class 2** –We have been writing our own directions in English using Imperative verbs. In Maths year 1 have been using related facts and Year 2 have been continuing their work on Multiplication. In Science we have looked at deciduous and evergreen trees and talked about the differences. In RE we have explored Shabbat and looked at Jewish festivals. We also had a lovely non-uniform day with hot chocolate.

**Class 3** - This week, in Class 3, we have been making our own lapbooks about the volcanoes around the World. The children have researched information and created intricate books with tabs, mini-books, lift flaps and fascinating fact pockets. In maths, we have been finding out about perimeters and areas in Year 4 and converting measurements in Year 3. In R.E., we have looked at what a priest does - a typical week in the life of a priest. We have considered the fasting of Keith Hebden and the protest of Archbishop Sentamu and how he cut up his dog collar in protest at the regime of Robert Mugabe in Zimbabwe. In PSHE, we have been looking at resilience using the analogy of different balls and self-regulation. In science, we have been continuing our work on forces and have begun work on magnets. In P.E., we have been carrying out gymnastic routines on the mats involving forward and teddy bear rolls -looking for those good starting and finishing point and control.

**Class 4** – This week in English the children have been continuing to write and edit their diary entries. In Maths, Year 5 have started a new fractions topic; Year 6 have finished their decimals work. In Science, the children were sorting the Vertebrates cards into two groups, mammals and not mammals. The children enjoyed being in the hall and being able to discuss the different vertebrates. In Art, the children have been completing some still life paintings and drawings. We loved our hot chocolate and popcorn today too!

The children will need to bring their Bicycle and helmet for the training session. It is essential that all cycles should be in good working order and that they are of a size that matches the rider. Saddles should be at the right height for the size and confidence of the child. Bikes should have two working brakes and tyres should be pumped up to the right pressure.

Children will need to wear a cycle helmet and have clothing suitable for changing weather conditions, including a waterproof.
