Class News

Tyne Class

In Tyne class we have continued our learning all about the Easter. We looked at Easter symbols. We listened to the Easter story. We sequenced the story pictures and did some fabulous writing all about the story. We ate hot cross buns and discussed how Christians eat these at Easter to remember that Jesus died on the cross. Can you tell an adult the Easter story? How will you celebrate Easter?

Thames Class

Thames Class have been writing a recount based upon the Great Explorer. We used adverbs, expanded noun phrases and conjunctions to make our writing interesting. In Maths, Year one has been looking at related facts and Year two have been recognising amounts of money. I am sure they would love to work out the change at the supermarket. In science, we have looked at natural materials and talked about their properties. We have also started our history topic Magnificent Monarchs. Perhaps they could share their knowledge about some monarchs at home. We have also had a fantastic visit from the Angling Trust. The children loved practising their fishing skills.

Rhine Class

In Rhine Class, we have started our new theme on the Egyptians for history. The children are really excited about this. We have already looked at some artefacts that were found by archaeologists. In P.E., we have been learning our Dandiya Raas dance using the sticks that the children have made. We have been democratic and the children have voted for their own music for the dance. In English, the children have been writing a newspaper report about a character from 'The World's Worst Children'. In art, the children have been improving their drawing skills by sketching pictures of statues. In computing, the children have become quite adept at programming and debugging - including using the correct terminology such as debugging and algorithm. Remember next week, our design and technology homework is due in. We have had some super Shaun the Sheep designs already in, so keep them coming. It would be great to see our designs come to life!

Nile Class

To introduce decimals, the children used manipulatives on a place value chart to represent different decimal numbers. In pairs, one child made the number while their partner stated the number made. After that, the children then explored how to make decimal numbers using the part-part whole models and bar models. How many ways can 0.25 be represented using a part-part whole?
