Class News

Tyne Class

Tyne class are loving our new topic this half term 'Growing' and we have been busy doing exactly that! We have planted some cress 'hair' and have also planted potatoes and lots of bulbs to make our outdoor area look beautiful. We have learnt what plants need to grow and are making sure we look after them well. Maybe you could grow some flowers, herbs or vegetables at home. As we are finding out, it's great fun!

Thames Class

Thames class have had a super few week. We enjoyed finding out about the Jewish festival of Shavout and are looking forward to our new topic Islam, in RE. In English, we have used adjectives, verbs and nouns to write a shape poem about a sloth and a Kennings. In Maths, year 1 have been partitioning numbers using the part whole model and year 2 have started to look at fractions. Perhaps they could practise halving and using quarters at home? In Science, we have discovered why the length of day changes in each season. The children were very interested in finding out about how the Earth tilts. We also enjoyed our book festival in Hexham.

Rhine Class

In Maths, Year 3 have been working on capacity and volume - if they could practise reading and measuring at home as much as possible, that would really help. In Year 4, we have been working on dividing 2-digit numbers by 10 and 100. If you could identify where decimals are used in our world - i.e. money and time - this would be very helpful too. Our Year 4 children have also started to practise the times table check practise materials to help them become familiar with what will be expected.

We have started our Egyptian theme and the children are already 'hooked' into some of the 'gory' details about mummification. In design and technology, we have been thinking about creating a machine to lift heavy objects. Our work with local artist Becky Mae has also begun. We had a fantastic first session with her. We even continued our learning at lunchtime by planting some trees and weeding the flower beds.

Nile Class

The children have started athletics this term by looking at sprint starts and reaction times. For the first couple of lessons, everyone has taken part in a game called 'Fox and Hare'. Very quickly, everyone realised they needed to place their feet in a starting position ready to push off as fast as possible. Please work with your child to find out how many different athletic events they could compete in during competitions.

Assessments

We are coming up to the time of year when some of the children will be completing assessments. These are national tests which are compulsory for all schools to undertake in the summer term. However, staff ensure that we make these as stress-free and accessible for children as possible. Our curriculum is designed and structured in such a way that the children will be ready for these. Year 6 will undertake their SATS starting on the 9th May and finishing on the 12th May. These are more formal tests which are externally marked.

Year 2 SATS will be held over a two-week period in May and will be delivered in small groups by the teacher and are marked internally. Year 4 will have a multiplication tables check in June and Year 1 will have a phonics screening check in June also. If you would like any additional information, please speak to your class teacher after school. We know how amazing all of your children are and we are proud of the achievements of each and every one; a test cannot show this.
