Learning Achievements

Class 1 – This week all the children in Reception class get 'Star of the Week'. All the children were really enthusiastic to start school and everyone greeted me and Mrs Storrow with a huge smile which really made our day. All the children have been enjoying exploring our classroom environments inside and outside and have done so well to incorporate our new 'Covid routines' into their school day. We have had a great start to the year and Mrs Storrow and I are very proud of how they've all coped with their first few days in school. Well done everyone!

Class 2 – We have enjoyed seeing our friends again this week. We have done the introduction to our new topic, 'Memory Box' and have been investigating with our Maths equipment.

Class 3 – This week we have been archaeologists and have carried out a 'dig' in our school grounds. We found lots of stones and some weed suppressant. In Maths we have begun work on calculations and in English we have been finding out about the Stone Age period and describing features. We have looked at aerial maps and some historical sites in the UK

Class 4 – We have had a lovely few days back at school and have enjoyed getting to know one another. In English have been researching about our new topic Ancient Egypt, discussing prior knowledge and questions we would like to find out during the topic. We have completed a chronological report about the discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb. In Maths we have begun our work looking at Place Value. Welcome back!

The staff team and I are so proud of the children and the way they have settled into our new school routine so quickly. We have been very happy to see the children back in school this week.

Curriculum

The government guidance is clear in that it allows schools to consider their own context in deciding how to offer the broad and balanced curriculum that students need in order to enjoy school and succeed. Throughout our planning we have taken into account the need to keep everyone safe: students, staff and parents. Students have been away from school for a long period of time and our desire is for them to return to as normal a school experience as possible; this is important for both their well-being and education. We will continue to follow the Cornerstones topics with a huge focus on reading; it will be incorporated into many lessons throughout the week. We do recognise however, that there will be many challenges ahead, which require your support to adapt to unfamiliar routines and practices, which allow us to deliver a high quality curriculum and learning experience whilst keeping your families and staff safe.

Staff will be sending out homework and spellings via Google classroom. You will receive information regarding log in details by your child's class teacher.

Attendance

All students will be expected to attend school. If your child is absent through illness please notify the school in the normal way. If your child has the symptoms of coronavirus, (persistent cough, fever, loss of smell or taste) please do not send them to school and seek a coronavirus test immediately. If a student receives a positive coronavirus test, the school must be informed immediately. Failure to do so would put all members of our community at risk.

Attendance is compulsory for all children, unless your child:

- Is self-isolating.
- Has symptoms of Covid-19 or a positive test result.
- Is in close contact with someone with coronavirus.

Behaviour expectations

Alongside our normal expectations of behaviour, we will expect the children to respect the new measures and way of working. Please see our school website for an updated behaviour policy which compliments the most recent version of our risk assessment.

Visitors

We shall continue to try to minimise the number of visitors' onsite. We are operating an essential visit only policy. Please continue to call or email the office if you have any queries to avoid unnecessary visits to the school premises. To aid this, please ensure your child has everything they need for the school day before they leave home.

We hope that these measures will prove temporary and we shall of course keep you informed of any change in guidance and practice. If you have any questions or queries, please email the school office admin@henshawprimary.uk

End of the school day

It has been brought to our attention that some adults are not practicing social distancing measures near to the school building at drop off and collection times. We understand that this new way of working is a lengthy process and we thank you for being patient with us.

Please can we remind you that we must adhere to our risk assessment which includes practicing social distancing both in and around school. We have obligations as staff and governors to protect our children and families and keep them as safe as possible-but we need your help and vigilance to do so. We do not want to increase risk unnecessarily.

Starting on Monday 7th September we are proposing the following for collection at the end of the school day. Please be aware that in order to put these measures in place, the school day will now finish at 3.20pm:-

The main entrance to school will still be the collection point but we will send children out in groups with 5 minute intervals in between each group starting at 3pm.

3pm-Sibling groups

- 3.10pm- Reception children
- 3.15pm- Key Stage 1 (Class 2)
- 3.20pm- Key Stage 2 (Class 3/Class 4)

In order to help us do this successfully, please be prompt for your collection time and leave the premises straight away to avoid congestion.

Children who access wraparound care will be taken to after school club as normal. Children who travel on school transport will be taken out at 3.15pm by a member of staff.
