Class News

Tyne Class

Tyne class have been reading the story of The Enormous Turnip and did a fantastic job of making story maps and of retelling the story orally using story language. Maybe you could retell the story to a family member? We created cone puppets of the characters and also practised our counting using character pictures. We have also loved exploring our new outside equipment including our cosy den, water trays with pump and large blackboard.

Thames Class

Thames class have enjoyed sharing their music homework. Thank you for supporting your child with this, they all have excellent taste in music!

In maths we have been practising addition and subtraction. Year 2 have been adding and subtracting across 10 and Year 1 have been looking at number sentences and using the part whole model. In English we have been reading Room on the Broom and writing our own letter to the witch, remembering to use the correct punctuation. We have enjoyed investigating recipes in Design and Technology and have made soup, which the whole school enjoyed tasting.

In Science we have continued to find out about what plants need to survive. We even designed our own carnivorous plant. I am sure the children will enjoy explaining how their plant survives.

Rhine Class

In Rhine Class this week, the children have been working on editing and refining their written work, whilst creating their own stories about the Stone Age. They have been trying to include all of the grammar, punctuation and spelling learning that they have acquired over the half-term in producing this cold write. In Maths, the children have continued to work on addition and subtraction up to 4-digit numbers with exchange. Year 4 have also been carrying work out on area. In history, the children have learnt more about the Beaker Pot people and written down some interesting facts. They also took part in our annual Harvest Festival celebrations at our local church. In P.E., they have completed the final lesson on netball and finished with a netball match. We have had a super half-term and are looking forward to the next.
