As well as continuing with NUFC, we have been fortunate enough to secure sessions with Commando Joe's in September and we can't wait to work with them!

The COJO programme is based upon the following 4 principles alongside the RESPECT framework:

- 1. Character development is a right for every child
- 2. Character education will empower young people
- 3. Character will inform the ethos, direction of learning and culture of the school
- 4. Character should be developed in partnership with staff, pupils and parents

We will aim to build the confidence of our children before they leave at the end of Year 6 and believe that children with high self-esteem are better able to make difficult decisions under peer pressure, approach adults for support, and be self-sufficient in their learning. We have selected the COJO programme for children from Reception to Year 6 as it develops resilience through many activities including being part of the team, performing challenges and having a leadership role.
