Learning Achievements

- **Class 1** This week we have been exploring our community further and have been talking about people who help us. The children have enjoyed our Vets role play area and have been making all the animals better. We had a visit from the local firefighters. We thought of questions to ask. We also had a go of using the hose which was very exciting! We painted some wonderful pictures of the fire engine and firefighters. We learnt that we need to dial 999 in an emergency. We have been practising careful counting and having been helping 'counting dog' to get better at his counting. In Forest School we enjoyed the Japanese art of 'Hapa Zome' and we created some fabulous leaf and flower prints.
- Class 2 We have enjoyed a messy mixtures afternoon. Investigating how household materials can change. We have started to look at the Queen's Coronation and in English we have been discussing and describing Pinocchio as part of our Topic about toys. In Maths, Year 1 have started to look at the Part-Whole model and how it can be used to add numbers; Year 2 have been counting in 2s and 5s.
- Class 3 This week in Class 3, we have been learning all about instructions. We watched clips which showed how Stone Age tools were made. We then looked at the features of instruction writing. We gave Mrs Clarke instruction on how to brush your teeth. We followed instructions to complete our art and then wrote instructions for our work on science Year 3 did 'How to make a robotic hand' and Year 4 recorded 'How to carry out their scientific investigation'. In today's Big Write, the children had the opportunity to write instructions on how to play their favourite game. In Maths, we have been carrying out addition and subtraction of 1s, 10s, 100s, 100os. In French, we learnt colours and reinforced what we have learnt so far. In History, we have been looking at a timeline for the Bronze Age and we also looked to see where in the World Stone Age paintings have been found.
- **Class 4** This week, Class 4 have become editors and publishers in English. We have enjoyed the different roles and jobs this entails. In Maths, we have been using long division and finishing our work on addition and subtraction. Class 4 enjoyed some French games and were great detectives while trying to work out the missing letters from the note! In Science, we have started our investigation 'How does the Moon move?'
