Learning Achievements

Class 1 - This week we have been learning about nocturnal animals. We have read the story 'Owl Babies' and used sponges to paint some very cute owls. We talked about how the owls felt in the story. We have been practising our reading and have been looking at the tricky words 'to' and 'the'. We have been exploring the properties of different materials and created clothing for our bears from the materials. We wrote words to describe the materials. We went on a very windy walk and saw lots of snowdrops. It was exciting as two trains passed us at the same time and we got a toot! In Maths we have been practising our addition and have been writing addition calculations. We have also been exploring the part-part-whole model.

Class 2 – This week, we have been talking about how to stay safe online and designed our own Internet Safety posters. In Maths, Year one have been counting forwards and backwards to numbers within 50; Year two have been sharing equally and started to look at the division symbol. In English we have been writing lists and explaining to Marley the Meerkat which clothes he should bring on his visit from Kuala Lumpur. We also had a fantastic Lego afternoon!

Class 3 - In Class 3 this week, we have been writing some volcano poetry using a pyroclastic flow approach - the children wrote them quickly in four minutes and they are excellent. We looked at adjectives, nouns and subordinating conjunctions. In Maths, year 3 have started work on measuring perimeters and Year 4 have started work on fractions. In Science, we have been trying hard to get out balloon card working, but it has been very tricky - with our growth mindset, we stick with it and showed great perseverance and resilience. In P.E. we practised our gymnastics routines and our forward rolls, teddy bear rolls and cartwheels. Our artwork has been completing repeated patterns using printing. In PSHE, we have covered the PANTS rules with Pantosaurus and Safer Internet Day. This busy week was finished off with a Lego experience which was thoroughly enjoyed by all!

Class 4 – This week, in English, the children edited their diary entries then performed them to the class with tone and expression! In Maths, Year 5 has been working on mixed number fractions and improper fractions; Year 6, have been working on percentages and how to convert between fractions and decimals to percentages. In PSHE, the children wrote blog entries about working for a Christian charity and including some great ideas.

We were extremely lucky to have our LEGO experience today and we loved it!
