This week in Tyne Class, our maths focus is around 'sharing'. We have read the story of The Squirrels Who Squabbled to help us embed our learning of sharing and to encourage us to apply these values in our own play. We have taken part in lots of practical activities including sharing out chunks of celery between our hungry caterpillar friends, we came up with our own interesting ways of sharing the food and had fun learning through exploration. We weren't keen on the smell of the celery though! In English, we are writing sentences about what we enjoy doing at school. We're becoming amazing at remembering our capital letters, finger spaces and full stops! In PSED we are learning about our bodies and how amazing they are. We'll begin to think about what happens when we eat and exercise and how we are all unique. We have loved learning through play in the areas of our classroom and we have especially enjoyed the sandpit in the sunshine!

Thames class have been busy listening to the story of Katie Morag and the two grandmothers in preparation for writing a diary entry. They have been using pronouns and writing in the past tense. In Maths they have been finding thirds and looked at writing unit fractions as well as recognising the whole. In science they have continued to look at habitats and have researched facts about elephants. In history we have looked at Elizabeth II and put kings and queens in chronological order on a timeline.

In Rhine Class this week, we have started our new theme 'Interconnected World'. The children have been finding out how to plot symbols on a map using compass directions. In science, we found out all about our teeth and what their functions are. In art, we have been creating our contributions for the Roman Wall Show making landscape pictures, which fitted in really well with our theme 'Vista'. In maths, we have been finding out about coins and their value. We have been counting amounts, making amounts and estimating amounts. In English, we have started our diary entry. We are writing an diary entry as though we are Lil - the main character from our guided reading text 'Secrets of a Sun King'. In P.E., we have started to practice our athletics for sport's day and have had our first rounders session.

In Nile Class this half term, the children will have the opportunity to read 'The River Prince' written by the author Saviour Pirotto. This will be the final book in the trilogy and the children are already predicting who the prince might be and what he might do during his Amazon adventure.
