Our Federation Dance Festival

Greenhead and Henshaw Primary schools, once again, competed in our Federation Dance Festival this year, at Haltwhistle Leisure Centre. As you could see from the videos posted to our Facebook page, the standard of dance was very high across all classes. It was wonderful to see the children's confidence blossom as they performed their routines to the other

children.

Unfortunately, the judges had to choose only one winner from each school (a very difficult decision) - congratulations to Danube class and Nile class; this year's proud winners of our Dance

In Tyne class we enjoyed listened to the story 'Errol's Garden' and we talked about Errol living in a block of flats and why he had to make a garden on the rooftop. We have enjoyed creating our own dream garden outside, using different flowers and pots. In maths the children have been learning about number bonds to 5. We can name number bonds to 5 and we are starting to develop an understanding of number bonds to 10. At home you might want to create your own dream garden, just like Errol's garden.

Thames class have enjoyed being back after their Easter break. We have started to look at money and add amounts to find totals and compare amounts. I am sure they will be able to add some amounts when they go shopping. In English we have looked at nouns and verbs to write a Kennings poem. In Science we have compared the seasons and talked about how the temperature changes. In History we are looking at the impact certain monarchs have had on life today including Alfred the Great and William the Conqueror.

In Rhine Class this week, we have begun our new music theme where we are looking at the Beatles and their legacy. We have also started to find out about the work of Howard Carter and his finding of the tomb of Tutankhamun. In English, our focus has been on using sentence starters to help create tension in our work using wide, imaginative, rich vocabulary - i.e. 'Everything stopped, people were stood like statues all around me.' In maths, the children have learnt about how to use possessive apostrophes in their work. We have begun our new module on time in maths and the children have been reading the time to 5 minutes. If you could encourage your child to read the time at home on an analogue clock this would help them enormously. The children were very excited today about their first swimming lesson at the Wentworth Centre - they were positively buzzing. Finally, we are trying again with our hatching of eggs and another 16 eggs have been put into the incubator. They should hatch around 20th May.

Over the next term, in guided reading lessons, the children will be sharing a story entitled 'The River Queen' written by Saviour Pirotta. This book is part of a trilogy series. So far, the children have already enjoyed reading 'The River King'. Over the next term the children will explore similarities between the two stories while predicting the next events for each chapter and inferencing the feelings of the main characters as they embark on each new adventure.
