Christmas time!

We are starting to get to the time when we begin to prepare for Christmas plays and performances, as well as all the festivities that Christmas brings with it! Please have a good look at our 'dates for the diary' page, which lists all the upcoming Christmas events which the school has to offer on the run up to the end of term.

Children are starting to come home with lines and scripts to learn and are very excited to be involved with this. Thank you for your support in helping your child learn these and we are looking forward to seeing you all for some great shows!

Recently, Tyne Class have been focussing on the story of The Three Little Pigs. We have loved building houses with different materials and testing whether the wolf could knock them down with a huff and a puff! Children enjoyed role playing the story and coming up with their own ideas on how the pigs could trap the wolf - some of us even built wolf traps on the field! We have also been learning all about some seasonal celebrations such as Bonfire Night and Children in Need. We created some beautiful firework art and organised a fashion show to show off our amazing spotty outfits!

This week, we have been busy in Thames Class doing lots of practical activities. In R.E., we have found out about the Festival of Sukkot in Judaism and have made our own Sukkah in our classroom. Sukkot is their Harvest Festival. In Music, we have started to practise the songs for our Christmas Nativity. In English, our phonic work has continued, and we are starting to write our own diary entries. In Science, we have been exploring UV rays using UV beads. In Geography, we have been thinking about what 9 photographs will represent our school the best. In Dance, we have started our animal dance. In Maths, we have been learning how many sides and vertices different 2D and 3D shapes have and have been learning how to draw shapes on squared paper. Look for shapes in the environment with your child and see how many of each shape they can identify.

Rhine class have been busy working on their knowledge of multiplication and division in Maths. In English they have started to plan their own narrative, based on the story Blast to the Past. In Science they have planned an experiment to identify the suitability of different soil types in order to grow plants. They had a wonderful time at Wark celebrating Remembrance Day. They have also looked at advantages and disadvantages of technology in the world today. They had some super questions and answers. Perhaps they could share this information at home. They are also very excited about the production of Aladdin and have already started to practise the songs.

The children in Nile class are having great fun with Miss Hannah this term. They are working collaboratively to create a dance performance to share with all of the parents and others class in the Federation at this year's Christmas production, which is Aladdin.
