Photography Workshops and Photography Art Gallery

Next Wednesday, children from Reception to Year 6 will be working with our Co-Chair of Governors and resident professional photographer, Sarah Smith, to create their own pieces of art using photography. With props, lenses, manipulation software and a keen eye, all children will produce their own photograph with the expertise of Sarah.

On Wednesday 19th February at the end of the school day, we are welcoming all families into our front entrance and hall to view these photos and purchase them, as part of our first photography art gallery. All profits from this workshop will go towards enrichment opportunities for the children in our school. We hope to see you there!



There has been lots of learning taking place in Tyne Class over the last few weeks. We have focused our learning on the texts 'The Great Race' and 'How to Catch a Star'. We have also enjoyed taking part in lots of hands-on activities relating to measurement and capacity. In RE we have been learning about the importance of looking after our environment, we have tied this into our Forest School sessions where we have been continuing our learning about birds. We have explored light and dark and compared our days to those of other countries. We were really interested in learning about why people in some countries might be asleep when we are still awake! We have also taken part in lots of activities around the Lunar New Year. We were able to reflect upon our own experiences of celebrations and compare them to the celebrations that take place over Lunar New Year.

Thames Class have been busy in English looking at how to plan a narrative based on the story Be brave little penguin. We have looked at different sentence types and descriptive phrases. In Maths we have continued to represent addition and subtraction sentences using concrete and pictorial representations. In Science we have compared the structure of animals. In DT we have made our own animal shelters and then built a shelter out of different materials in the outdoor area.

In Rhine Class this week, we have been working on writing a newspaper article about the fastest human on Earth - Usain Bolt. We were particularly impressed by his determination and resilience to reach his goals. Our newspaper articles will include facts about his life to hanging up his running shoes in 2017. In maths, we have been finding out about lengths in kilometres, metres, centimetres and millimetres. It would be good if you could highlight what a kilometre is on your next journey so that they get a feel for how far this is. In PSHE, we have continued our work on feelings and emotions. This week, we learnt about the downstairs and upstairs brain and their functions. In Geography, we have learnt about the mountain ranges of the UK, and used maps and compasses to learn about direction. We also had a workshop on 'Green skills' and built our own wind turbine finding out which team could produce the most volts. Our curriculum has been so rich and varied and we have made good use of our wonderful learning environment.

This term the children in Nile Class have been exploring how to move around the large and small gymnastics apparatus. The children had looked at how to create starting and finishing poses to enhance their routines, their routines have been full of jumps, twist rolls and balances. They have worked in small groups to create routines, this in turn has developed their listening skills, allowing the children to support and learn from each other.
